## 1. MDRP Program Management

- ✚ In June, the MDRP Secretariat continued its focus on working with the Government authorities to extend DDR support in the DRC, the Mid-term review of the Burundi National Program, and trust fund-related matters.
- ✚ On operations, the Secretariat conducted several missions during the month:
  - **Angola:** Secretariat staff conducted an ADRP implementation support mission from June 18-30. The mission found that the Government had initiated the long awaited for discharge of Government forces (the FAA) and was continuing to make good progress in expanding support to vulnerable groups. However, the mission remains concerned about continued slowness of reintegration sub-project processing and in relation, the feasibility of assisting the remaining projected beneficiaries not yet discharged from the FAA.
  - **Burundi:** Secretariat staff participated in the Mid-term Review of the National Program from June 4–15. The mission acknowledged progress on the demobilization and reinsertion of 23,000 ex-combatants and the dismantling of armed militia but also noted that much remains to be done to complete the pending caseload of those to be demobilized and accelerate reintegration support. The mission agreed that an additional 10,000 ex-combatants would need to be demobilized before the end of 2007 and 16,500 reintegration opportunities need to be implemented by the end of 2008. To this end, the Government agreed to prepare an Action Plan as well as improve oversight of the project, M&E and decentralization.
  - **Central African Republic:** The Secretariat co-led a mission to CAR from June 21-28 with UNDP. The mission reaffirmed the relevance of a national seminar on SSR and laid the groundwork for the Government to organize the event.
- ✚ Total MDRP **Trust Fund** (TF) disbursements through the end of June 2007 reached \$206 million, representing a \$3.5 million increase over the level of disbursements through May. With no new income received during the same period, the TF cash balance stood at \$14 million. Although indications of new financial support from several existing MDRP donors (and a formal pledge from the Government of Germany) have relieved the cash-flow difficulties somewhat, efforts to limit TF disbursements to Angola, Burundi and the DRC will continue until the outstanding Dutch contribution is released.

The Secretariat has continued efforts to raise funds to close the overall funding gap of the program, which stands at approximately \$50 million. As recommended by the TFC in Paris in May, the Secretariat has concentrated its work in securing additional funds from those donors already involved in the MDRP and continued discussions with the African Development Bank (ADB) regarding a possible contribution to the TF under the new ADB allocation, effective 2008. The Secretariat is also continuing its analysis of potential savings in Burundi and Angola resulting from lower than expected beneficiary case-loads, which would also contribute significantly to reducing the projected financing gap.

## 2. Regional Activities

### **Technical Coordination Group (TCG)**

The Secretariat and the Rwanda Demobilization and Reintegration Commission (RDRC) co-hosted a TCG meeting on Psychosocial Issues in DDR in Kigali, Rwanda, on June 28 & 29. The meeting covered numerous themes including the identification of child and adult ex-combatant post-traumatic stress symptoms, and approaches to dealing with the challenges they pose. MDRP TCG delegates from Angola, Burundi, the Central African Republic, the Republic of Congo, the DRC, and Uganda as well as other MDRP partners attended this meeting.

### **Second International Conference on Stability and DDR in Africa**

MDRP participated in the Second International Conference for DDR and Stability in Africa in Kinshasa, June 12-14<sup>th</sup>; participants included Government officials from 20 African countries; disarmament, demobilization and reintegration beneficiaries; members of national armed forces and former insurgent factions; parties to peace accords and representatives of host communities and civil society organizations.

The aim of the Conference was to provide a forum through which to share experiences and strategies on the challenges the continent faces on a number of thematic issues including children in armed conflict; the links between disarmament, demobilization and reintegration, transitional justice and security sector reform; problems related to the presence of combatants on foreign soil and the importance of public-private partnerships to improve the prospects for the long-term reintegration of ex-combatants.

The MDRP Secretariat played an active role in the Conference. The first Plenary session included a presentation on 'Lessons Learned in the Implementation of the MDRP'; the second day of the Conference saw the screening of MDRP film 'Buying Time for Peace' and included a Q & A session chaired by the World Bank's DRC Country Manager, Jean-Michel Happi. Finally the MDRP Secretariat played an important role in co-chairing the COFS break-out session alongside UNHCR.

### **Combatants on Foreign Soil (COFS)**

The Secretariat completed the study on 'Opportunities and Constraints for the Disarmament and Repatriation of Foreign Armed Groups from the DRC', which was presented to governments and other MDRP partners in Kinshasa and Kigali during the month of June. The MDRP Secretariat is consulting with relevant governments and other partners on next steps for dissemination and follow-up.

## Analytical and Knowledge Management

- **HIV/AIDS and DDR:** A second draft of the regional study was distributed to HIV/AIDS stakeholders at the 2007 Africa Region Consultation in Kigali June 10-19. Final guidelines will be ready for distribution by the end of August.
- **SSR/DDR:** The Secretariat published a second Working Paper: Beyond Demobilization: Opportunities and Challenges for Security Sector Reform in the Central African Republic on the website, with an abridged version available in French.
- **Child soldiers:** A review of MDRP support to children formerly associated with armed groups is being prepared and will be issued as a Working Paper in August.
